# Q&A's About the Windibops Relaxed Performance

### •Who can come to a relaxed performance?

Anyone that would benefit from a relaxed performance including people with an Autism Spectrum Condition, sensory and communication disorders or a learning disability (and their parents/guardians/carers).

#### •Can I see the theatre before the show?

Yes, the doors to the theatre will be opening early and you're welcome to go in and have a look around.

### •Will there be anywhere quiet I can go if I need to?

Yes, we will be making a studio available as a comfortable 'break out zone' for anyone who wishes to take time out during the performance.

### •Can I take food and drink into the show?

Yes, you are welcome to take food and drinks into the theatre.

## •Can I film and take photos of the show?

Yes, absolutely.

### •Who are the characters in the show?

The three characters will all be introduced to you at the start of the show so you can get to know who they all are.

### •Will there be any loud noises or scary parts of the show?

The show is about scientific experiments, so there will be some noises throughout, but there is only one loud bang. The show also features a laser and one flash of light.

### •Will it be dark in the theatre?

The house lights will stay on for a little bit longer than usual, and the theatre will remain light throughout the entire show. There will be no total blackout at any time.

### •Will the theatre be crowded?

For this performance we have reduced the seating capacity so that there will be more room in the theatre and no one will feel cramped.

### •Will there be a BSL interpreter?

Yes, one of the performers is a BSL interpreter.

# •Am I still allowed into the theatre if I'm late?

Yes, with a relaxed performance we are really flexible and understand that it might take a while for you to get to the theatre.

### •Will there be staff to ask questions?

Yes, we will have plenty of staff in to support your visit and answer any questions you may have.

#### •Will there be space in the theatre for wheelchairs?

Yes, please contact our ticket office to book a space for a wheelchair user.
