Classes & Workshops

We introduced a number of new classes in 15/16 expanding our range and reach, and significantly expanded our offer for people aged 55+.

We supported 34 freelance teachers to deliver our regular classes in 15/16 invested in free intensive training in autism awareness, inclusivity and first aid. We also introduced a Dance City uniform for teachers.

Improvements were made to our studios' sound systems and aesthetics; we created additional space and installed new studio floors.

Learning Academy

Our Learning Academy goes from strength to strength with 2015 seeing our first graduates emerge from the MA Professional Dance Practice.

In May 2015 Dance City Centre for Advanced Training and Gateshead College BTEC student Connor Scott became the first ever BBC Young Dancer in a live TV final at Sadler's Wells. Our BA (Hons) Dance Professional Practice degree with Gateshead College and Northumbria University saw its first ever third year head towards graduation.

This vital area of Dance City's work aims to train and retain the best dance talent in the North East.

Professionals

Dance City works extensively to support, develop and promote dance artists in the North East of England. We are passionate about the amazing talent we have in the region and provide numerous opportunities for that talent to flourish. We have a free daily class in ballet and contemporary dance and various guest teachers from across the world and in addition deliver a number of specialised workshops



focused on areas such as making promo videos of work and working with producers. We commission up to 8 new pieces of dance work from North East based dance artists each year and provide performance opportunities at our theatre and at partner venues across the whole of the North of England. We support many dance artists in their funding applications to other funders and provide free or subsidised studio space for the making of that work. We invite dance artists from across the world to our residency programme, where they will create new work. Regional dance artists are invited to watch this process and often attend a sharing of the work at the end of the week.

Additionally we commissioned a full-length performance by regional artist Kristin Kelly-Abbott. Launch Day, bringing to life the paintings of the Wee Gadgies by Alexander Miller, toured to five regional venues and was well received. *To Suit*, a 20 minute performance created by regional artist Lizzie Klotz and commissioned by Dance City toured to Leeds and Manchester, representing Dance City in our Northern Platforms partnership.

We set up a new, two-year professional development initiative, Expanding Horizons, to support dancers, choreographers and producers in the region to enhance their skills and accelerate their development. This project, funded by Esmee Fairbairn Trust and Dance City, has taken ten young professionals through a programme of leadership, management, entrepreneurship and creative intensive sessions, providing mentors, opportunities to travel and to set up new business models.

As an emerging dancemaker in the North-East, Dance City's constant support and guidance has been invaluable, enabling me to create work and tour it regionally. Dance City is so supportive and sympathetic to the needs of dance-makers and dancers providing them with countless opportunities for professional development


Care to Dance
